Thank you for your letter of 6th August addressed to our Hon. Secretary.

We will gladly put your request in News for Naturalists, but would be grateful for some more details.

Climbing plants growing in the British Isles are as follows:

Climbers (woody) (clockwise): Honeysuckle Lonicera periclymenum,
Climbers (non-woody) (twining clockwise): Black Bindweed Polygonum convolvulus, Hop Humulus lupulus, Black Bryony Tamus communis.
Climbers (non-woody) (twining anti-clockwise): Field Bindweed Convolvulus arvensis, Great Bindweed Calystegia sepium, Common Dodder Cuscuta epithymum, Greater Dodder Cuscuta europaea.

Do you require dried specimens or seeds of the above plants?
