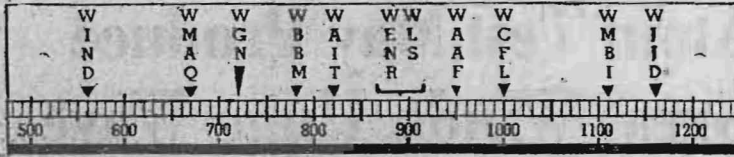

Wheaton Man Got Radar Signals from a Star

on radio engineer and a Chicago publishing executive who are inclined to think it may be 60,000 years old. Grote Reber, the radioman, picked up signals from a star with a sheet metal radar reflector he set up in Wheaton eight years ago. He thought at first they were from cosmic rays. . . .

But Ray Palmer, Ziff-Davis Amazing Stories editor, who read his findings, claimed Reber's equipment would not detect cosmic rays. Hence they must be radar waves. . . . Since then, Reber has kept his reflector beamed on the star, and gets signals periodically. . . . Palmer claims there is some evidence that ancient civilizations had discovered radar and used it through space.
