The Burpee, Esterline-Angus, Brush, Tracerlab catalogs, also carton of ten tubes and headphones arrived on 11th February. The rubber ear pieces arrived this morning. Everything was in good condition. Thanks. You marked the packages nicely so they went thru customs without any questions.

The new design of headphones has much too stiff cord and headband. I removed the ear pieces and attached them to my old headband and cord. Quite satisfactory. All I really needed was the ear pieces.

Please check up on Gilson catalog I mentioned in my letter of 14th December.

A short note of mine will be published soon in SCIENCE. I am having the reprints and bill sent to you.

My hand continues to improve. Its strength is nearly back to normal. All the motions are present, however somewhat limited in amplitude. The bottom side of wrist is still swollen and continues warmer than normal. That is where sharp end of bone broke thru surface and most damage to tissue occurred. Apparently a few more months will be required before it settles down. I continue to do exercises every morning and evening.

The changeover from pounds, shillings and pence to dollars and cents was nearly painless. Most of the old paper money and copper coins have disappeared. The silver probably will be around a while.

I look forward to visit from Mr. Hinkley.
