I have read with interest your letter of 19 April, and the enclosed article from NATURE on the subject of Radio Astronomy in Hawaii.

In regard to your inquiry concerning aerial photos made of the installation on Mount Haleakala as it existed in 1953 or 1954, I regret to inform you that a thorough search of the files of Navy photographic libraries within the Fourteenth Naval District reveals no record of these photographs.
