Sometime ago we had correspondence about twining vines. Shortly after your letter of 17th April I planted eight kinds of pole beans. These are all doing well. Six of the kinds were selected from seed catalogs and I know their names. The other two are growing from seeds given to me. Unfortunately I do not know their names. These two varieties are the most successful for my experiment. I intend to save the seed and continue the study next year.

Next time you are over this way please stop by and I will show to you my bean patch. Perhaps you will be able to identify the two unknown kinds of pole beans. This can probably be accomplished best before the vines dry up. Your comments and suggestions will be much appreciated by me.
