About a year and a half ago I wrote to NBS requesting some data on the Buenos Aires station as it was developing that Argentina is an important place in this study. Unfortunately it must have been misplaced as I never received a reply. While it is now too late to include the Buenos Aires data in the article I would still be interested in working up whatever is available to see how it fits in with the general picture.

If possible, please send to me legible copies of the data sheets giving monthly tabulations of the hourly values of foF2 at Buenos Aires from the inception of the station down to the present. These are the sheets containing the spread F notation. I understand that a station has recently been opened somewhere in Brazil. If so, the same data on it would be most acceptable.

Upon receipt of these data sheets I will analyse the spread F part and advise you of my findings and how they fit into the world wide picture.
