Dear Joe:

Dave Heeschen and I have set a tentative schedule which we hope will be convenient for you and others whom we would like to see in Australia. We cannot leave before November 17 because of our AUI Executive Committee meeting on the 16th, and Dave needs to be back before the 30th because of a special conference on discrete sources being held early in December. You can see that our trip will have to be hurried although I believe a reasonably good job can be done because most of you are in the vicinity of Sydney.

We hope that the following schedule can be arranged:

November 17	-	Leave New York
November 19	-	Arrive Sydney (Qantas at 0635)
November 20-24	-	Sydney, Fleurs, and Parkes
November 26-27	-	Canberra for Heeschen and Melbourne for Tape
November 28	-	Sydney, depart for U. S. (Qantas at 1900)

Can you suggest a convenient hotel in Sydney, or even better, have CSIRO make two single reservations for November 19 through November 24. We should be able to make arrangements for the remainder of the stay after we arrive.

You are fully aware of the various people whom we should see. We certainly want to talk to you, Wild and Bolton at CSIRO. I would like to see Taffy Bowen if he is available during our visit. From your letters I believe that there are others whom Dave and I may not know but with whom we should talk to get the benefit of the most recent Australian experience. We also would like to visit the University group and see Mills, Christiansen and Hanbury Brown. We would like to see the equipment at Fleurs and at Parkes. Can we impose on you to schedule our time from Tuesday, November 20, through Saturday, November 24, to achieve as much of this program as is reasonable. I have not suggested scheduling anything for the 19th because Dave and I expect to be somewhat groggy from the trip and the time change.

October 31, 1962

Dave Haeschen wants to see Bart Bok. He tentatively has set aside Monday and Tuesday, the 25th and 27th, for the trip to Canberra. Dave will write Bok and make those arrangements separately.

I would like to see Dr. White and am prepared to go to Melbourne to see him if he is available on the 26th or 27th. Of course, should he be in Sydney at some time during the previous week, I would take a little time to see him there. I will write him to advise him of my visit and see what arrangements can be made.

I have tentatively scheduled my own departure from Sydney along with Dave for the evening of the 28th. The schedule outlined above does not include any visits to atomic energy installations, and I believe that while I am in Australia it might be helpful for me to spend a little extra time in order to visit the research establishment at Lucas Heights and perhaps talk to the people at the Australian Institute of Nuclear Science and Engineering. As I understand it, the Institute has some of the same objectives which AUI has in making research facilities available to university scientists. If I do include visits to the atomic energy establishments, I will do this as an extra and stay for a few days after Dave leaves.

Dave will drop a note to Bok and Mills advising them of his visit, and I will drop a note to White and Bowen about mine. However, we hope that you will be able to contact the people in the Sydney area and set up a schedule for us so that we cause the least inconvenience to them.

We are looking forward to seeing you and Mrs. Fawsey again.
