If you are interested I can show you several patches of Larnia-orous plants growing in Tasmania. Some contain digested insect remains others contain live victims.

It is not a large plant its biggest victims I have noticed is a gallant and a small grasshopper. This seem to be the most popular diet. It has a flower but this is not the trap.

The trap is round surrounded by a dozen or so thin fingers tipped by a white glaucous mixture which resembles dew. When the victims touch this they cannot get away. The fingers tighten round them and they all seem to be dragged into the base that first. I remain
