SUBJECT: Housing at Green Bank

- The attached table shows the expected growth of the total resident staff at Green Bank, and housing required.
- 2. The remanent staff coming in to Green Bank from elsewhere will want their own off-site housing. However, they will need assistance. The area around Green Bank can probably absorb 6 to 8 families, with houses presently available. Many of these houses would need remodelling however. The MRAO will probably need to provide some temporary housing for remanent staff, while they hunt for places, or have remodelling done, or a home built. It will not be long before the influx of remanent staff exceeds the available housing. Some staff may want to build or buy homes, or do extensive remodelling. The NRAO may have to consider ways to assist them financially, in view of the present extremely noor home financing situation in this area.
- 3. Housing will be required for visiting scientists with families, and for visitors who don't bring families. In addition, some housing should be rrovided for visitors wanting to stay for a few days, and for the NY staff.
