Dear Hap:

This is in reply to yours of 15th April. Not much interesting has happened here. I still work on my Haleakala data but it is a cumbersome job. I have over 1300 hours of observations and the chart paper ran $1\frac{1}{2}$ " per minute. Eventually it will all be digested, organized and off to the printers.

From time to time I think about Emberson and a big mirror and make sketches. It can be done, but someone will have to work at it right along instead of only once in a while. This will be part of my job at Green Bank.

Attached is an envelope with three copies of "Between the Atmospherics". I like this paper better than most any other I've written; its so different. Also enclosed is a bill. Please have it paid. The cost seems high but it is really nothing compared to all the time and money and effort expended getting the subject matter together.

I have had one exchange of correspondence with Green Bank. The fellows seem enthused about radio astronomy and appear pleased to have me join them. However, between the lines, I gather that the facilities are still quite rudimentary. I'm supposed to be a "visiting radio astronomer" but I have a hunch that they are not yet in much shape to receive visitors.

In view of the above and the relatively slow progress here, I believe it wise to defer my arrival at Green Bank from 1st of July to 1st of August or even 1st of September. This will give them more time to get their house in order. Incidentally, if you haven't heard, there is a roaring good sugar strike going on here. I'm interested to see the performance first hand, play by play.
