Dear Dr. Reber,

Prof. Bok has told me about the two dark patches that you have found in your survey and that may be due to ionized hydrogen. We intend to photograph the two fields with the 8-inch f/l Schmidt camera and with the Uppsala Schmidt telescope. As soon as I have any results I will let you know.
