Dear Grote:

This will acknowledge, somewhat casually I am afraid, your letter of June 24 and the financial round-up as well as the other news.

As you may recall, things get somewhat into the doldrums here this time of year, and so I can promise no immediate surge of activity on the score of a squaring of finances. However, as you know, our sense of affiliation has been strong over the years and I would certainly expect that our Board would wish to maintain it. Unfortunately, the Board will not be getting together again until sometime in September. On the other hand, if there is any pinch as far as you are concerned, please let me know and we can get off an interim shipment of funds in more modest amount to relieve that while awaiting the opportunity for formal action.

I am, of course, delighted to hear that some of the things you had hoped for at Haleakala are developing well, and I would gather from both your words and other impressions that things well beyond even that may have developed. Your note of potential financial needs well beyond anything that we have thought about before is not surprising. I would like to know a little more of what you have in mind, however, before considering any of our friends in more dough-heavy foundations. This brings up too, of course, the question of whether you have any thoughts about a return to this side of the world in the finite future for general principles as well as for acceptance of more honors. I am sure it would be much more satisfactory to talk about some of the future which you can envisage than it would be to try to cover it by correspondence.

Continuing best wishes for the winter results, and I'll hope to hear from you again before too long on these mundane fiscal matters.
