Brodiaea

in honour of James Brodie of Scotland 1744 - 1824, who in 1800 discovered the *Pyrola uniflora* in Britain. (6 ins. : Lvs., towards base of st., orbicular or ovate a third to an inch long, obtuse, rounded at base: fls. white or pink, fragrant $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ in. across. Woods, N. Amer., Eu., Asia.) Also Lily including *Hookera* or *Brodieae* and *Priteleia* (of about 30 slender Herbs) natives of Western, northern and southern America.

Brodiaea Volubilis

Flowers rose-red of those densely 15 to 30 flowered twining 12ft. blooming in July leaves no limit lanceolate 12 ins. long California 1874 (B.M. 6123) Synonymous Stropholirion Calaforicum half hardy.
