You have been on my calendar and on my conscience both for well over a month. I certainly had the best of intentions directed to conveying appropriate season's greetings to you if nothing else. However, with the year-end activities involved here and their attendant meetings, reports and whatnot, the good intentions paved another section of the well-known road.

I was glad to hear from you and interested in the controversy presently under way at Green Back.

I have heard nothing about the coil winding machine from anyone other than you. Possibly I will be in touch with Emberson before long and see if I can find out if it has become a matter of issue at Columbus Circle. I suspect that the issue of the coil winding machine would be more freely and fully resolved than that of limitations on the areas in which the Observatory may operate.
