Thank you for your good letter of 28/6/63. The plants arrived in fine condition at moon of the 27th; only about 24 hours from time you dispatched them. They have been divided into three nearly equal groups, right, left and unknown. All imbers have been planted in sandy equal. Host of the stous have been cut off to make the roots send up now shoots. These will be given asple supports to trine upon from the start.

The plant is a variety of Asparagus belonging to the Lily family; probably A. asparagoides known to florists as Smilex. Now. "Hammal of Cultivated Plants" by L.H. Bailey, page 215. Exact identification can only be made after examination of the flowers and seeds. Undembtedly the plant was introduced for arnamental purposes and has gone wild.

When flowers and seeds become available we would appreciate receiving complet. A few color photos of the flowers would be very decirable. I thank you for your interest, effort, and oc-operation. An appropriate chaque is enclosed.
