SUBJECT: Joseph L. Pawsey

We have concluded that the best way to handle Dr. Pawsey's compensation for the visit he is making to this country two weeks from now is to place him on the NRAO payroll on a stipend basis computed at an annual rate of \$25,000 commencing March 14, 1962 and ending the date of his departure from this country, which will have to be ascertained when he gets here. I am confident this arrangement will be satisfactory from his point of view.

During his stay in this country, Dr. Pawsey's status will be that of a non-resident alien, and I understand there will have to be a withholding in the amount of 30%, although the tax he pays will be less than this. The important point, of course, is that he get precise information about his compensation and withholding in ample time for him to get his sailing permit before he leaves for Europe. He is returning to Australia via Europe. We will discuss all these points with him when he gets to New York, as well as with you and Frank Callender. If he falls in with the plan proposed by Dr. Rabi, I assume he will apply for his sailing permit when he is in New York for the April Trustees' meeting.

Please regard this memorandum as authorization for placing Dr. Pawsey on the payroll on the basis set out above. I am sending a copy of this memorandum to Frank Callender.
