## Haleakala Scientist Seeks Source of Space Radiation

An imposing steel structure that looks like a playground climbing gadget for children was put into operation high atop Mt. Haleakala, Maui, recently to catch "cosmic static" radiated from someplace out in space, roughly in the vicinity of the Milky Way.

Although rumors were circulated that the structure was beling used to check flying saucers, in a dually used as an experi-

it is actually used as an experi-mental radio wave finder.

RADIO ENGINEER Grote Reber, who constructed the mechanism, is attempting to discover the source of various radiations from outer space.

Located at the 10,000-foot level

on the crater's summit, the apparatus is mounted on wheels and can be revolved slowly to scan the sky for sources of "static" which may be emitted from some particular place in the sky.

A diesel engine owned by the Hawaiian Commercial & Sugar Co., Ltd. furnishes the power which operates the mechanism.

MR. REBER chose the Maui location because he wanted a high mountain surrounded by water.

The ocean acts as a large mirror The ocean acts as a large mirror which reflects radio waves from the sky, and the reflections, in turn, "bounce" up to the mountain top where the apparatus picks them up and records them. The radio engineer, who is a "ham" operator in his spare time, is a resident of Wheaton, Illinois, and a graduate electrical engineer.

and a graduate electrical engi-neer from the Armor College of Engineering of the Illinois Insti-tute of Technology in Chicago.

HE HAS ALSO done graduate work in astronomy and its allied sciences at the University of Chicago, while employed as an en-gineer for various radio compa-

In early experiments with earth-bound radio waves, Mr. Reber learned that "static" was coming from a definite place in the sky. Now, with more elab-orate equipment at his disposal, he is trying to pin-point the exact location of the source.
