Dear Mr. Reber:

With reference to your need for charts, enclosed is a copy of one which we received from a place in New Jersey which supplies such things. To our untutored eyes, it looks like yours except for not being specifically concerned with a ship. If this meets your needs please let me know. It is a stock item so we can order it by the 100's as you need them.

Maps: I have ordered the 15' detail maps of the Michigan areas you requested in your December 4th letter. Since the Illinois and Wisconsin indexes had only just come in, I included those requests in the same order.

I asked the U.S. Geological Survey to send the maps directly to you if possible. Last time I did not request this as I thought I'd be able to check what they sent if the maps were forwarded here. However, I found that short of taking a knife to the mailing tube I couldn't conveniently take the maps out, so I just remailed it to you. They may have some rule against shipping out of the country, since it probably can't be done under the frank, but if you do get them directly, here are the maps I ordered of the 1:250,000 variety, within the 40° to 45° latitude: Illinois: Aurora, Burlington, Chicago, Danville, Davenport, Dubuque, Peoria and Rockford. Wisconsin: Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison and St. Paul. Michigan: Fort Wayne (1962) and Toledo.

I am requesting information about the aerial photos separately.

Telefunken has an office in Long Island City. I called them and, while they don't carry the Filters you asked about, they said they would write to their home office and find out. Will let you know when the information comes through.

I.E.E.E. returned your charts but the reprints of that article haven't come yet. Shall I just keep the charts here?
