Dear Dr. Reber:

We have received your letter of 2 Oct. 1961.

There seems to be some mix-up, or something, with the mail service since you apparently have not as yet received our letter of 6 Sept. 1961 in which results of analyses on 4 of the samples were reported. I can find no reson for this unless it was forwarded by surface mail instead of our usualair mail. We reported 5 additional results in a letter posted 9 Oct. 1961.

In Addition to the reasons for delay quoted in these previous letters, we also experienced a slight delay in getting the samples through customs.
