

Further to our discussions of twining plants, I wonder whether you saw a letter by R. L. Jones in Nature 185, 4715, 755, March 12, 1960? He has experimented with plants grown in a uniform environment which have been rotated at one rev./day, and gives results which appear to indicate that clockwise rotation inhibits growth, and anti-clockwise rotation stimulates growth. There are some other interesting results also.

I thought that you might like to see this article, and might also possibly like to make a short detour to see this work as you pass through New Zealand during your annual exodus from the Northern Hemisphere!
