Dear Mr. Rebel:

Thanks very much for your letter of December 3 saying that what I have said about your early work in Radio Astronomy is substantially correct.

I was particularly interested in your recent results of observations of celestial noise at frequencies of the order of hundreds of kilocycles. This poses interesting questions as to the electrical mechanism that might give rise to such low frequencies. You no doubt have thought this through and have the answer.

I am interested too to hear that you plan to be in our neighborhood sometime in January. I shall indeed be very glad to see you. As you might expect I am woefully out of date on present-day radio astronomy but I am nevertheless very much interested.
