Dear Mr. Reber:

Replying to your letter of January 6, we are glad to attach photostats showing the cone and drum, revised in accordance with your specifications. For these the prices are:

Cone	Lots	of	1	\$81.40 each	
Drum	Lots	of	2	\$11.65 each	
Chuck	Charge			\$ 4.00	

These prices are quoted f.c.b. shipping point 108.70 and are subject to change without notice.

The chipping and hammering of the welds will make the welds smooth and give it a wrought structure instead of cast.

Our original quotation did not include welding of the fins at corners; however, it is included in the figures given above, but these welds would not be finished.

Our charge of \$3.00 for the chuck for the drum has been increased to \$4.00, due to diameter increase. This charge was for turning down a stock chuck, using a stock adaptor. However, if we must ship the chuck to you, the charge would be \$10.00 since we must make the chuck and also furnish the adaptor.

No scrap would be shipped you inasmuch as we have allowed you credit for this in our quotation.

We estimate that shipment could be made within approximately seven to eight weeks after date of receipt of your order, complete specifications, and approved blueprints. To.

The drum charge mentioned in our letter of January 3, should have read, "3.60 each." We will ap-preciate your marking your records accordingly.
