Apparently I did not send any report last month. The letter of 7/7/66 from Sam Smith with enclosures arrived promptly. Soon thereafter substantial literature arrived from Nuclear Enterprises but nothing has been heard from Pilot Chemicals. Perhaps they need prompting. The R.C. spring quarterly bulletin and two packages of Cosmic Ray Astronomy reprints arrived on 22/7/66. Half of these are wasted because I remove the upside down figure and paste it right side up into the remainder. Please send sixty more copies by sea.

I signed and returned the auditors inquiry directly to Lybrand, Ross Bros. & Montgomery on 16/8/66. The reprints (ten copies) of "Aborigonal Carbon Dates from Tasmania" went off by sea three weeks ago.

After considerable haggling, I placed an order with Johnnie Masukanie for five experimental geiger tubes. The fillings are to be all different. They use ethyl formate for quenching agent.
