Thank you for your letter of yesterday. The seed samples arrived on the 17th. Both envelopes are marked *Vigna sinensis*. Sample 29280 of 1961/2 contains two kinds of seeds. Both are shaped like small beans. One kind is dark red. The other kind is grey with fine yellow specks. Could these be two different varieties? Sample 34891 of 1964/5 contains light tan seeds shaped like small peas. Which, if either, of these samples is *Vigna sesquipedalis*? I am starting some of each kind in tests for sprouting.
