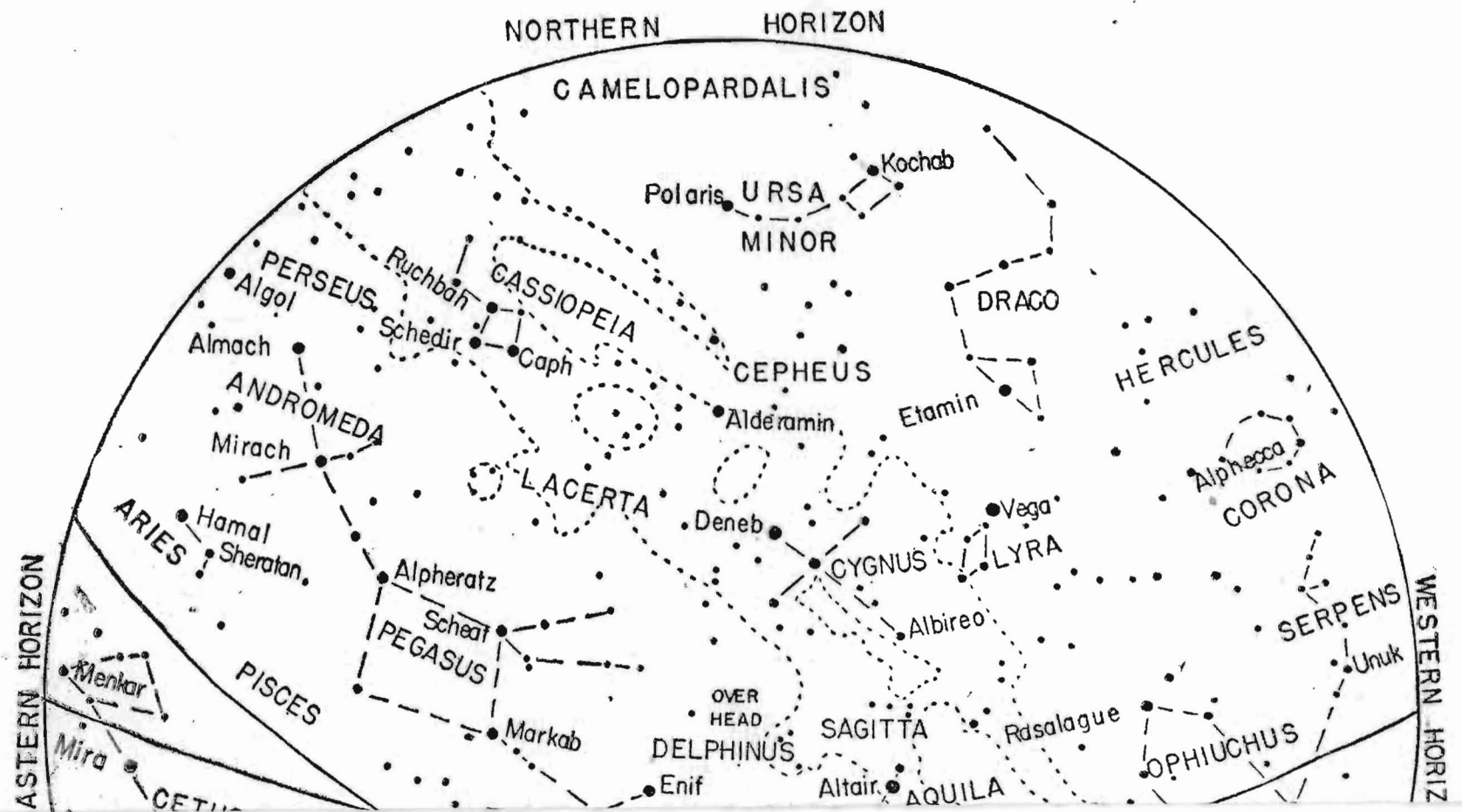


# October Evening Star Chart



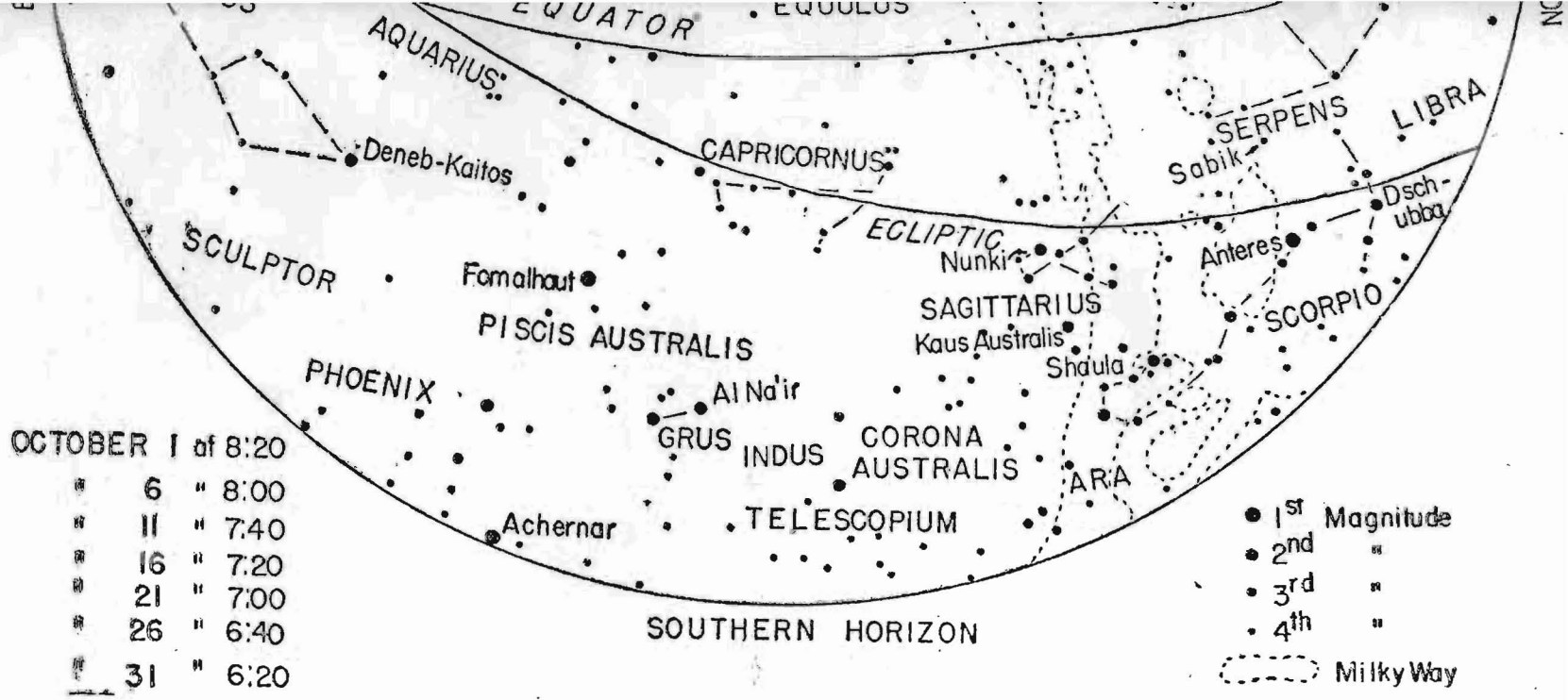

**THE PLANETS DURING OCTOBER**

Mercury will not be visible dur-

ing the month.

Venus is becoming progressively more prominent in the western evening sky. It will spend most of the month in the constellation of Libra, the balances, appearing to shift into Scorpius before the beginning of November.

Mars is higher in the western

evening sky than Venus, beginning the month in Scorpius and then crossing half of Sagittarius, the archer.

Jupiter, in the constellation of Aries, the ram, is just rising in the eastern evening sky.

Saturn will not be visible during October, being in conjunction with

the sun on the 10th.
