Please parion this long delay in answering your and Jeans letter of February 2lat. My nigotiations with the Auetrailane bogged down as it tumed out I was negotiating with the wrong people. I am now negotiating with the people direotiy in Tasmana. This is muoh more matiafaotory. It turns out that there is a Univeraity of Tasmania in Hobart. Also the National Oberwatory in Canbarrea maintaine a station or observatory on the outsifrts of Hobart. They are doing some radio experiments which are in a general way agoociated with what I want to do. Hobart seems to be quite a large oity judging frow the maps and literature they heve sent we. The population is over 50,000 and there seems to be quite a bit of industry such as lumbering, mining, smelting, etc. They have offored me the use of a 10 aore field atation whioh is 11 miles outaide of Hobart and assiatance in getting betup and maxing measuremente. Hobart conneots with Sydney by air and by sea. It is built on a large estuary so oonaiderable harbor fadilities are available. This probably acoount for its size. They have given me a quotation of 30 pounds or about 44 dollars to setup an 80 foot pole complete with guy wires. This is less than a quarter what a similar pole would oost here in Hawail. Apparently one can get more for his money nearly anywhere outside of the U.S.A. It ia my intention to continue work here the rest of the eummer and then go down there in September or Ovtober. Sumer in Tasmania is from Ootober thru March. Thus it will be poseible to get setup during favorable weather. The actual measurements I wish to make are best done during their winter from March thru August. It acems probable that $I$ will be there for a yer. So far the largest rub seoms to be getting the atuff I need here. All the manufacturers in the D.S.A. seem very coy when it comes to giving any actual delivery date. In self defense I have ordered some of the necessary itema from Muliard in England and am having them sent directly to Hobart. Some times I think that this country needs good depreseion.

In regand to the long discussion about oircumstances in Wheaton, I have little to offer from this distance. You will have to do what over geems best to you and that wili alac be beat for me. After your driving mo about tom last inter, it is quite evident that the town has changed greatly and is going to continue to do so. I have no with to 11ve there again. Aleo it appeare that realeatate is greatly inflated. If you have to make a ohange it seeme that jou should sell in theaton where you oan get more money for leas and then buy somewhere out weat of the Fox river where you oan get fere for lest money both in property and in sexyioes. olf one mork in ohioago and has to live in the euburbs, that is one thing. Iour businese lis, or will be in Aurora, $s 0$ you can live farther out where thinge are lesa competitive and more economical. The way. I look at it living in Wheaton is no bargain. This probably gees for any auburb within commiting distance of ohioago. In my estimation the big oity has gotten far beyond the limit of diminishing returns.

A11 those boxes in the garage are pretty heavy and I have little belf pat anyone is going to (und any. However the oontents is quite "asily damaged by water. Thus if they have to be outside for any time during your moving operatings please be sure to have then well covered with a waterproof tarpaulin of some Eind.

It dote not seen likely that $I$ will be needing any of that fumaiture in the anio and I oertainiy an not going to apend any money ehipping it around. Perhape it will be well to save it as you may like to have some of it at a later date. Forinstance, when the small fry get a little larger and you have more roonin a new establishment, you may well be able to use the dining room table and ohaire whioh are up there. I think there is a chins oabinet and a book dase also, plue some other thinge whion I cannot remember.

Presentiy you should be getting most of my technical journals. I had the maliling addrean changed when I thought I was going to Australia this opring. How that the trip has been defered to autuma I would like to see what ie in them. Howerer I do not wish to ohange the melling addrese back here for the few remeining months. You might lag a bushel or so out to your factory and have uike put them in a woodan box. Then take the box dam to the exprese oxice and have it sent out here. The exprese company has an office at rehului. On seoond thought the goode will probably come just as fast is you sond thom by irelght via Matson lines as that is the way the express comes. Die your own judgment. I'll pay the shipping charges at this ond.
