

Aerogramme March 15, 1955

Dear Schuyler:

For the past couple of weeks I have been getting some results but they are so different from my expectations that I cannot understand them. In order to clarify matters it seems advisable to construct a second receiver which operates at a markedly different frequency and make simultaneous observations. Consequently I may be able to use those coils from Broachian after all. There is a postal regulation which says things may be imported ~~free~~ ^{without custom formalities} ~~and~~ use free, provided the value is less than \$2 (\$4.50) and that the goods are for one's own use and will not be sold. I want to bring the coils in under this regulation. Also since sea mail is very ~~expensive~~ ^{lengthy} and I need ~~the coils~~ I might as well squander a couple of dollars on air parcel post. There are eight coils which weigh an ounce or so each. Please ~~to~~ ^{plain} wrap these in individual paper and then tie in a small bundle. Wrap the

bundle in paper ~~and~~ try to find
a rectangular or near cubical box
which will allow an inch or more
all around the bundle. Then pack the
bundle inside box with cotton
all around ^{and} attach to bundle a
note saying "Personal property of
Grote Tiber, value \$4.00"
Be sure to remove all other
identification which Broadway Coil
may have put on. I believe the air
parcel post is about \$2.00 per pound,
so if the package weighs less than
two pounds it should go for about
\$4.00 which I believe you presently have
on hand. I insure it for \$4.00. Sounds
ridiculous and it is, but I wouldn't bother
you about this except, since the coils
are already on hand it seems easier to
insure them than to duplicate them here
as matters go very slowly in Tasmania.
