Dear Mr. Reber:

Enclosed is a letter from Boston Edison Company about a split in their Common Stock. Enclosed with this letter were two certificates for your additional 181 shares as result of this split.

Apparently also, since they enclosed an order form, there was an odd 1/2 share which, if they get your instructions by July 20, can be used toward the purchase of a full share. As you will note on the reverse side of their letter, if they do not get instructions from you via this order card they will sell the odd 1/2 share and send along the proceeds. If you do decide to return the order card, it should be sent to:

They sent along an envelope but it's been domestic postagemetered - and anyway I suspect that you may not need to return the card. Or if you want to return it here, I'll ship it on in the provided envelope.

Your Cities Service Company stock certificate (67 shares) has come. There was also enclosed a check for \$147.40 from the Morgan Guaranty Trust Co. which represented the accrued dividends or the proceeds from sale of any fractional interest, or both. (They did not specify.) I've sent the check to Harris Trust etc. for deposit.

The First National Bank of Chicago returned the F.W.Means stock certificate which you send, requesting "guarantee of indorsement" by a bank or trust co. in Chicago. I suppose I could have written Harris Trust for this, but luckily Mr. Thwaite happened to be here so I turned it over to him. Harris Trust is the R.C. bank in Chicago and he knows a Vice President there, so he took it over, had them endorse your signature, and then delivered it to First National.

Mr. Schauer says to send you his greetings and best wishes. He has been traveling or attending meetings or conferences ever since your letter of early June and the slides came. He'll be leaving shortly for Canada and probably will not have time to write you, but is looking forward to seeing you the end of August. Incidentally, I've send a check to Dr. Harlan Smith for your stay at Yale.
