Thank you for your letter of the 14th. The enclosed reprint entitled "Reversed Bean Vines" describes past experiments. I wish to try the same thing with a clockwise turning plant. The Hop and Honeysuckle have seeds too small compared to casing and are difficult to handle. Black Bindweed and Black Bryony might be useful. I have no information upon them. Seeds in the casing would be most desirable.

Smilax is the only example of item (b) known to me. It is a feeble twiner. Perhaps someone knows of a better plant?
